Dear Gaesdonckers

The first two weeks of the new school year are now behind us. For the students, these were mainly marked by upcoming exams and class tests. At the same time, the coming weeks will once again see numerous extracurricular activities on the calendar, designed to make the Gaesdonck campus a great place to live. So, before we get into the mid-term report phase, we would like to end this weekend with a few brief reminders of upcoming dates:

## Calendar update



On Monday, 2 February, and Wednesday, 3 February 2026, the teachers' calendar includes **meetings** to discuss the interim report cards. However, students should not rejoice too soon: **both afternoon lessons and day boarding will take place as scheduled.**

On Thursday before the Carnival weekend, "**Alt-Weiber**", however, there will be **no face-to-face lessons and no day boarding school supervision.** For the students, however, the day is still a study day – they will be given assignments that must be completed at home. The subject teachers will be attending training on this day.



## Re-election of campus activities for the second half of the year

The coming weeks are now also the right time, especially for our boarding and day boarding students, to choose the campus activities for the coming half-year.

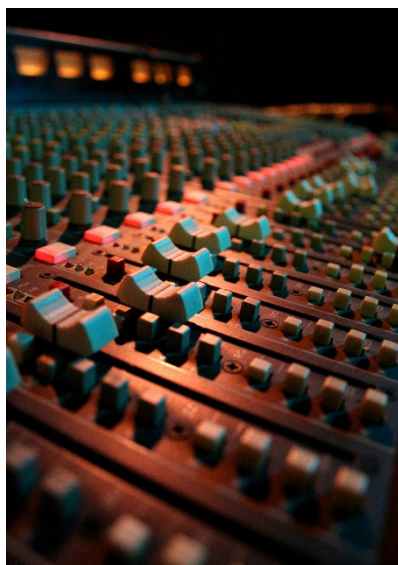
By February 6<sup>th</sup> 2026, you will receive feedback on whether your registration was successful – especially in the event that more students have registered for individual courses than there are places available.

The newly selected activities **will then start on February 9<sup>th</sup> 2026.**

As always, it is also worth taking a look for our external students. Many activities are open to all students, regardless of the type of attendance. These are marked accordingly in the selection. Two interesting examples:

### New to Campus Time: For lighting technicians and sound engineers

Starting this semester, we are offering a new **event and stage technology club** under the direction of Mr Poley, in which students from the Upper Tertia (Year 9) onwards will have the opportunity to gain a thorough insight into the technical support of our school events. The club is aimed at young people who are interested in practical work, technology and responsible co-creation.



Participants will learn how concerts, theatre performances, lectures and school festivals are technically implemented and supported. They will work in the areas of sound, lighting, stage technology and media and take on active responsibility for school events, always under supervision.

The club's activities include:

- Setting up and operating microphones and mixing desks
- Basics of live sound engineering (voice amplification, feedback detection, etc.)
- Creating and calling up lighting moods and using our lighting console
- Safe setup and operation of stage areas, platforms, etc.
- Setting up projectors and presentation technology
- Basics of camera operation and media control

At the same time, students learn teamwork, reliability and independent work. They are part of the technical team at school events and contribute significantly to smooth operations.

We welcome all young people who enjoy technology or would like to discover this field for the first time. The new club is open to students of all types of schools.

### Computer typing course

On 24 February 2026, the computer typing course will also start again as part of our campus programme. This is also open to all students, regardless of the type of attendance. There are still a few places available.

With former Federal Minister Christian Schmidt, we have once again secured a high-profile speaker for our Studium Generale. He will be our guest during the winter lectures on **Thursday, 26 February at 7 p.m.** in our auditorium.

Christian Schmidt has been the United Nations High Representative for Bosnia and Herzegovina since 2021 and has been President of the German Atlantic Society since 2006.

### Save the date (II):

#### LACHEN helfen e.V. charity concert

Just one week later, the **Münster Air Force Band** will be performing in our auditorium to support the charity LACHEN helfen e.V. in a joint charity concert organised by the Kalkar-Kleve Bundeswehr base, the municipality of Goch and the Collegium Augustinianum Gaesdonck.

LACHEN helfen organises aid projects for children in need wherever German soldiers or police officers are deployed abroad. This means that the association is often at the heart of crisis areas around the world, even in places where other aid organisations are unable to operate due to the current situation.

The focus of the current concert is a project in the Iraqi province of Shingal. During the genocide and expulsion of the Yazidis, many children lost their parents there. An orphanage was built for them in Khanke, where most Yazidis found refuge, which was later expanded into an orphanage school to provide the children with an education. However, there is still a lack of many items of equipment here, so the German soldiers from the nearby contingent stationed in Erbil decided to support this orphanage school. The donation from the charity concert will be used to finance the furnishing of classrooms and the purchase of urgently needed learning materials.



Thanks to the close cooperation between the association "Lachen Helfen e.V." and the German Armed Forces, administrative costs can be kept very low – meaning that almost 100 per cent of the donations go to the people who need our help the most.

The concert begins on **Wednesday, 4 March 2026 at 7 p.m.** – doors open for visitors at 6 p.m. Admission is free, but donations are welcome.

The trip costs **€ 650**. This includes return travel, accommodation, full board, all entrance fees, train journeys, cable car rides, additional accommodation for multi-day tours and snacks for the tours, etc.

Additional costs will be incurred for pocket money. We maintain a pocket money account on site and can also pay out in Swiss francs upon deposit.
